Advanced Leadership Camp

21 Aug-1 Sept 2017



Advanced leadership Cam, a 10 day camp was held in Agra. The camp is organized to empower the cadets with leadership, management and other personality enhancing skills that are necessary to tackle all kinds of hurdles in life. The cadets in the camp were kept upbeat at the prospects of seeing through the stringent SSB interview more confidently to join IMA or OTA to be an army officer. Leadership traits of team-work, team-building, motivation or moral boosting, goal-setting and decision making were also taught. Moreover, during the camp many activities like public speaking, debates, declamation, mock interviews, psychological test, screening test etc were held. Our cadet Kumar Vaibhav was selected through a due procedure and attended the camp gaining a great deal of insight on the traits of an officer.





Enrollment Drive

24-25 Aug 2017

Every year enrollment drive is conducted to enroll the new batch of students as 1st year cadets. This year also an elaborate enrollment drive was conducted in two parts (Physical test and Interview). A two days advertisement campaign was held before the assigned dates of the test. CDT Kumar Vaibhav and CDT Rajat were assigned the task of setting up enrollment desks at collage campus for ease of access to student interested in joining NCC. Use of digital technology as often suggested by our Hon'ble PM as a part of digital India campaign was done to attract the students. Willingness forms were meted out to interested students after submission of which they were called on 24 Aug 2017, for physical test. The selected candidates were then called in for interview on 25/08/17. JUO Vibhuta Trivedi, CPL Bharat Guglaini & SGT Savinoy Roy were given the charge of physical test. Then a board of rank holders was made including SUO Mohit Bishnoi, JUO Vibhuta and SGT Savinoy who took the interviews of each candidate. Around 45 Interested students filled up the willingness form from which 40 students were called in for the physical test and around 38 candidates were then shortlisted for the interview round. After the due process, around 27 candidates were shortlisted to be later interviewed by Lt Bhupinder, ANO-DCAC. Then the Short listed candidates were called on to submit their credential and required documents and were issued enrollment forms. Their documents were then scrutinized with the concerned authorities for zero error documentation.



Swacch Bharat Drive

31 Aug 2017

Taking the vision of a Swacch aur Adarsh Bharat of Ho'nable PM, Cadets of DCAC NCC unit took up the task of educating and creating awareness about the importance of cleanliness in or daily lives. Also, a cleanliness drive was initiated in and around college campus. Roping in the idea of digital India methods, cadets also prepared a video message on Swacch Bharat that was distributed in large numbers via digital means. CDT Abhisekh Yadav and CDT Aryan Sharma spoke in the video messages about the importance of Swacch Bharat and helped in creating awareness. The campus area was cleaned and a classroom to classroom campaign was done to create awareness about the same. SUO Mohit Bishnoi and JUO Vibhuta Trivedi led the event by personally going class to class and creating awareness of a Swacch Bharat.



Para Basic Course

31 Aug 2017



A specialist subject course, held twice every year. Para basic course is one of the most prestigious camps wherein 40 cadets from all over India (20 SDs + 20 SWs) per course attend it. The selection procedure is tough but the training is considered to be the toughest. It's a 24 day long course and for 1st time, 2 cadets of DCAC NCC unit CDT Shivraj Ahlawat and CDT Utkarsh Mathur got selected for PBC to be held at Para Training School, Agra. There were 20 NCC cadets from all over the country, from 17 directorates. For the course capsule-1 (Held in September) & for the course capsule-2 (Held in November). Cadets are made to jump out of the aircraft AN-32 and they descend at a speed of 121ft per sec. After the deployment of parachute, the speed of descent reduces to 19ft per sec. The height is around 1257fts from which the cadets are made to jump and in total, 03 jumps are required to earn the Para Wings.



Special Training Program-1

21 Sept 2017



A conference on disaster management was held under the leadership of Lt Bhupinder, ANO-DCAC in the conference hall of DCAC. CDT Anirban Barua gave a 30 minutes presentation on disaster management and then other 15 minutes were kept for the cadets to clarify their doubts. Cadets showed exemplary participation. After the event, refreshments were served and Lt Bhupinder, summoned up the day's talk as to what the cadets can learn from this and also shared his experience on the subject



Special Training Program-2

22 Sept 2017



Regular training sessions are conducted on Thursday and Friday of every week barring the holidays. Some specialized training programs were held during the academic session 2017-18. Cadets were given specialized training for field combat, various firing positions, basic training about weapons (0.22 mm Rifle). Cadets were also given training on service subject and emphasis on practical representation and training was given to achieve maximum participation. National Integration Camp

7-18 Oct 2017



National Integration camps and special national integration camps are conducted every year to make cadets understand and value the rich heritage of cultures that forge unity despite the diverse languages, traditions and religions of our country. These camps are conducted on All India Basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various states of India. 37 NICs are conducted every year. In addition, six special NICs are conducted in the extremities of our country at leh/Srinagar (J&K), Dimapur (North Eastern Region), Peddapuram (Kakinada), Badabagh (Jaisalmer), Lakshadweep and Port Blair. Around 600 cadets attend these camps from all over India. JUO Vibhuta Trivedi and CDT Satish Kumar attended the NIC Mumbai where they participated in NIAP and bought laurels to the NCC unit of DCAC.



Army Attachment Camp

23 Oct– 3 Nov 2017



Every year, cadets and officers are sent to attachments with regular army units on various locations across India. There, the cadets are taught field craft, battle craft, Military history and other different subjects. Also, special focus is given on military weapons training. The schedule there is run according to the strict schedule of that particular army unit. Cadets are also given the field training such as– Laying Ambush, Countering ambush and are also taught about infantry field formations during war. This year CDT Aditya, CDT Jai Prakash, CDT Vikas, CDT Sushant Rashpa, CDT Aniket, SGT Savinoy Roy and CDT Tushar attended the camp. They stood meritorious during the final tests and stood first in the field formation exercise competitions.



Pre-RDC cum CATC (Cadre-1)

Pre RDC camps are selection camps where on the basis of drill and cultural events cadets are selected through a 10 day long selection procedure. Also SUO Mohit Bishnoi stood the first position in the firing competition held in the camp and got the best shooter award.

Republic Day Camp

1-31 Jan 2018

The annual Republic Day camp (RDC) is held at Garrison Parade ground, Delhi Cantt every year from 01 Jan to 31 Jan. 2070 selected cadets from all states and Union territories attend the camp. This camp represents all parts of India and is thus called a 'Mini-India' event. The camp is normally inaugurated by the Vice President of India in the first week of January and culminates with Prime Minister's rally on 28 January. It is a matter of great pride for a cadet to be selected to represent his/her state in RDC. CDT Sushant Rashpa and CDT Shivraj Ahlawat participated in RDC-2018 as a part of the cultural contingent team and bought laurels to the unit.





PM's Rally 2018

1-28 Jan 2018

The Prime Minister's rally, the most prestigious event of the NCC RDC is held on 28 January every year. The PM's rally commences with the guard of honor that is presented to Hon'able prime minister by NCC cadets. Contingents from all state NCC directorate participate in the march past. Social activities being undertaken by NCC are displayed in the form of tableaux. IMA Attachment Camp

13-25 June 2018

IMA - The dream place of every defense aspirant in this country. IMA Attachment Camp started from 13th June 2018 to 25th June 2018 and SUO Shivraj Ahlawat was fortunate enough to be able to get selected for this prestigious Camp. Along with 3 more cadets from Delhi directorate SUO Shivraj reached Dehradun railway stations on the 13th June where 120 more cadets from all over the country had come to attend the same camp. Soon the famous IMA olive green bus came to pick up the cadets and took them to their destination. Accommodation was in the A.C.C. gentleman cadets rooms and meals were served in the ACC wing. Soon the routine for the next 12 days was announced by the Subedar Major Saab which was as hectic as one could possibly imagine. Day started at 4.30am followed by physical training from 5am to 6am and then drills session from 6am to 7am. The physical training covered non-stop running of 10km then a set of all exercises and ends with climbing up a rope. The timings for breakfast were till 7.30 which were deliberately kept so short so that the cadets don't over eat as we had lectures from 8am till noon. Lectures covered topics from map reading to first aid. Lunch was served at exactly 12 pm and no one is entertained after 12.30pm.





The Cadets get free time till 3 PM after which they have their games and physical activity period.

After the games session however, cadets go for their cultural practices to prepare for the competition that's held at the end of the camp. After this, they get supper and are allowed to go to bed at 9:00 PM

Moreover, cadets also get the opportunity to go for swimming, firing from .22 deluxe rifles, had classes for night march in the enemy territory and are shown of the Improvised Explosive Devices and how they are operated. On the second last day of the camp, competition begin. Cross-country competition of 10km with timings, Physical Training competition followed by the drill competition among three groups namely Alpha, Bravo and Charlie. In the evening a debate competition is held followed by the cultural competition and on the last night, the traditional Bada Khana ; which is the special meal in the defense which is served after a successful camp ends.

Dr. Naseer was presented with a token of appreciation to end the day. All in all, it was a great learning experience for all the cadets involved.

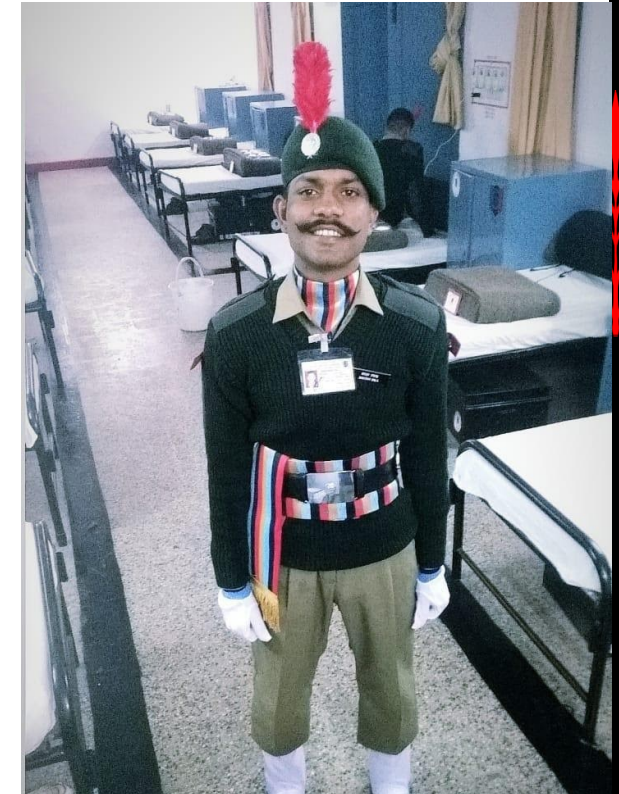


Republic Day Camp Parade

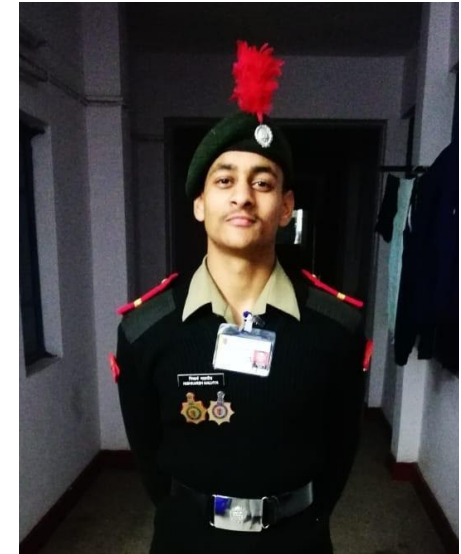
30 Jan 2019

He has been assigned a cross attachment with 6 battalion, The Dogra regiment, for a tenure of 2 years and will shortly be posted in Siachen glacier.

He has always been an inspiration to us. During seminar he said, “ when I reach Allahabad for my SSB , there were too many candidates like me who passed CDS and came here. The competition was tough which made me bit nervous but I was confident about myself that I can do it and eventually, I did it. So you must have the confidence for the work you are involved in and you'll gain success in the end.”





After cracking CDS (Combined Defense Services) entrance exam, he has taken his SSB coaching from Olive Greens Academy in Chandigarh. “when I was preparing for SSB in Chandigarh, there were people who were discussing about various topics regarding SSB so it created an environment which really helped me”, he said. Then with all hope he went for his SSB having various rounds which goes for 5 days starting from first day in which there is a Picture Perception and Description Test (PPDT) and Personal Information Questionnaire (PIQ) form which is followed by Word Association Test (WAT), Thematic Apperception Test (TAT), Situation Reaction Test (SRT) and Self Description Test (SDT) on the second day. Then on third day, there would be Group Discussion and Progressive Group Test (PGT) and the medical and result goes for the last two days.

Lt. Kaustubh Rana cleared it, and he got a letter to start his training at Officers Training Academy at Chennai from 1st April 2018. After 9 months of training he has been commissioned to the Indian Armed Services and is serving to the nation with pride and honor.

Pre-RDC CATC

October 2019

In CATC, cadets of a particular NCC unit participate in the 10-day camp. Classes are conducted as per the given syllabus wherein certain aspects of NCC training are taught once again. The camp acts as refresher training for the cadets and they are also trained in basic skills of survival and emergencies besides other topics. They are taught certain skills pertaining specifically to their Wing for e.g., a naval cadet are trained in boat-rowing, oaring, Semaphore, etc. Another activity in the camp is the "dogwatch" wherein two cadets are to stay on sentry duty for two hours at any time given time of the day. Those caught sleeping, especially during late night or early morning shifts, or otherwise missing from duty are severely reprimanded or penalized. Cadets are also introduced to weapons such as a .22 caliber rifle.

Before RDC all group headquarters have to face the IGC (Inter-Group Competition) where the cadets are filtered mainly on their drill standards and a few with cultural performance. Selected cadets under go training to face the Inter Group competition (state level). Similar events like IBC but bit more intense in selections. Following this, the selected cadets are given rigorous training. There's the contingent Drill that is given high priority along with BC and YEP prep. Post this, Cadets move to Flag area and Cultural practice.

This takes place during CATC, Pre-RDC.

This year, Cadet Deepak and Cadet Aradhya attended the CATC Pre-RDC. Cadet Deepak participated in the Best cadet competition while Cadet Aradhya went for Culturals.



NCC Republic Day Camp is the culmination of all NCC Training activities. RDC is held at Garrison Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt. from 01 to 29 Jan. 1850 Selected NCC Cadets from 17 directorates attend the Camp. The Camp is inaugurated by the Vice President of India and culminates with Prime Minister's Rally on 28 Jan.

- During the camp visit of Raksha Mantri, Cabinet Ministers, Chief Minister of Delhi, three Service Chiefs and various State Ministers/VIPs are also organized.
- During the RDC, various competitions are conducted amongst the 17 NCC Directorates to decide the Champion Directorate for award of Prime Minister's Banner.
- Competitions are keenly contested in various events such as National Integration Awareness presentation, Drill, Line & Flag Area, Cultural Programs i.e. (group song, group dance & ballet), Best Cadet of Senior Division (Boys) and Senior Wing (Girls) in each Service - Army, Navy & Air Discipline and Best Cadet Boys and Girls each from Junior Wing. Aero modeling and Ship modeling are also conducted during RDC.

In this camp, the cadets are trained by the instructors of the particular regiment, in the military tactics including day/night warfare & also get familiar with the weaponry. This year, DCAC got 10 vacancies for army attachment camp. The camp was held at Meerut cantonment.

The cadets were attached with Rajputana Rifles regiment for training. Other than being attached with Raj Rif, cadets stayed in regular army barracks with regular soldiers from the Punjab Regiment. The camp was under the charge of Major Mohit Sasan of Raj Rif. Cadets visited different locations during the duration of camp. These locations include– Officer's theatre, Artillery regiment, Remount veterinary corps and Armored regiment.

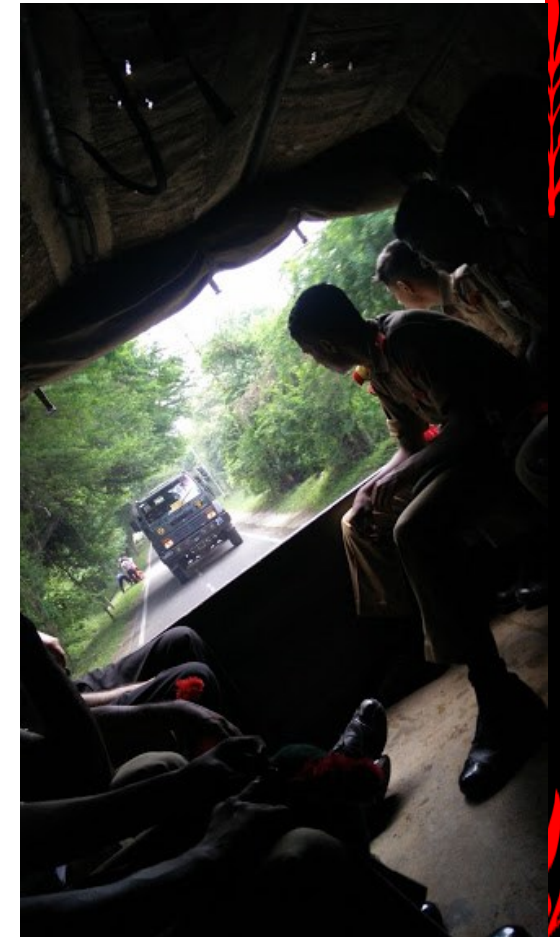

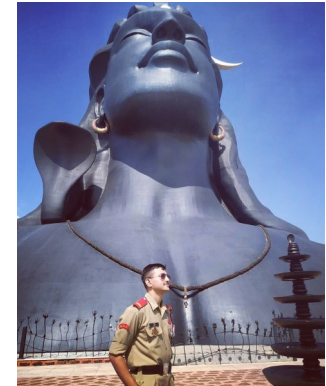
Advanced Leadership Camp

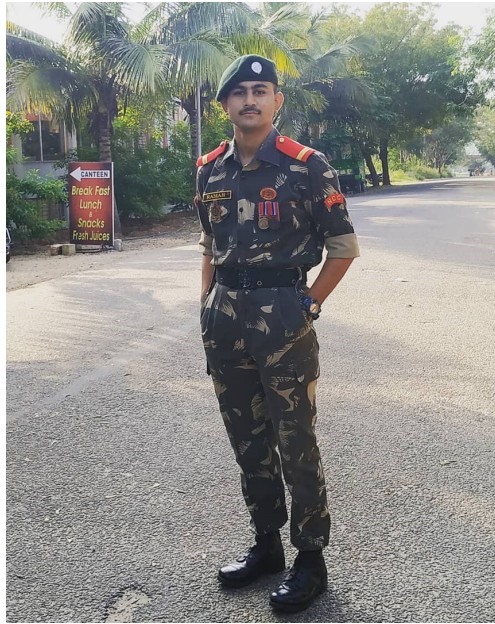
5-18 December 2019

Microlight Display by the NCC cadets is also conducted during the PM's Rally. The PM's Rally culminates with award of Prime Minister's Banner to the winning Directorate by the Hon'ble Prime Minister. Cleanliness Drive– Statue Cleaning

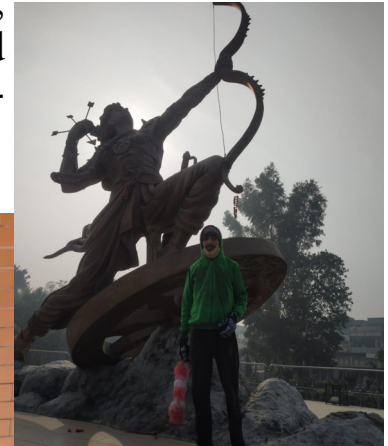
20 December 2020

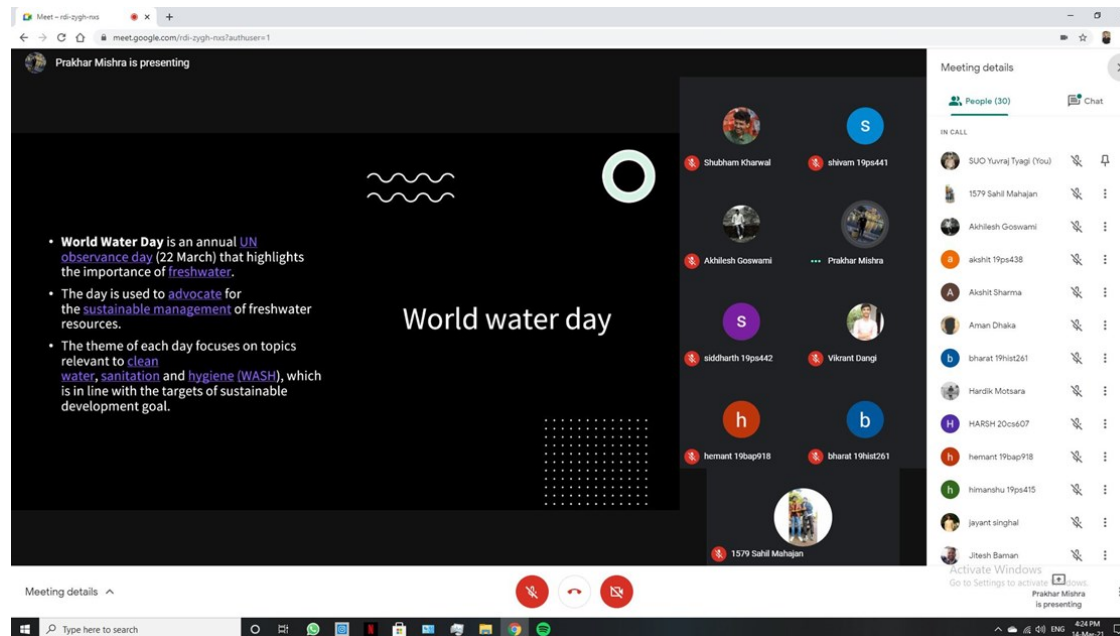




Webinar: Water Conservation

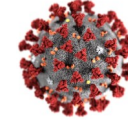
