These concepts and theories can be used to solve the country's socioeconomic problems.

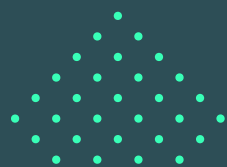
Mr. Bir Singh, Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics, founded this prestigious institution in 2010.
